Economic News

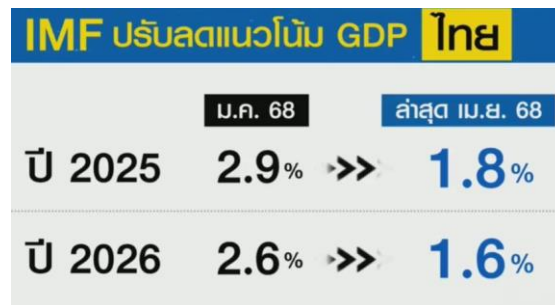
- The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has released the latest update of its World Economic Outlook (WEO), presenting global GDP forecasts under three different scenarios to reflect the rising uncertainty in global trade policies. This is the first time in several years that the IMF has given multiple scenarios for the global economy.
 - Reference Forecast: The global economy is expected to grow by 2.8% in 2025 and 3.0% in 2026. This forecast includes tariffs announced between February 1 and April 4, 2025.
 - Forecast before April 2 (when the U.S. announced counter-tariffs): The global economy was expected to grow by 3.2% in both 2025 and 2026, just 0.1% lower than the WEO forecast from January 2025.

- Forecast after April 9 (when the U.S. delayed the enforcement of tariffs by 90 days): The global economy is expected to grow by 2.8% in 2025 and 2.9% in 2026, with different growth drivers in each country, especially the U.S. and China.

- ❖ The IMF has also downgraded the economic growth forecast for the ASEAN-5 group (Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand). The group is now expected to grow by 4.0% in 2025, down from 4.6% previously, and 3.9% in 2026, down from 4.5%. This is due to trade links with countries directly affected by the trade policies, such as China and the U.S.
- ❖ As for Thailand, the growth forecast for 2025 has been sharply reduced to 1.8%, from the earlier estimate of 2.9% made in January. Thailand is the only ASEAN country projected to grow less than 2%. For 2026, the forecast is lowered further to 1.6%.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra said she is prepared to lead the Thai delegation to the US for tariff talks, after the Trump administration cancelled appointment with the Thai delegation and asked Thailand to review its proposals.



- ❖ Commenting on China's threat that it may retaliate against countries which give in to the US, to the extent that it impacts Chinese interests, the prime minister said that she is aware of such a prospect, adding that Thailand must maintain a balance in its relationships with both the two super powers.
- ❖ Meanwhile, Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira claimed that the meeting with the US delegation was postponed because the Thai side does not want to rush into the talks, but does not want to be too slow either. Thai side wants to wait and see how the talks between the US and other countries transpire but, despite the postponement, officials at the Thai Embassy in Washington DC are still working on the matter.



- Paetongtarn Shinawatra, the Prime Minister, posted a message on Facebook and tweeted on X about inviting relevant agencies to address the issue of product mislabeling in Thailand and the process of issuing Certificates of Origin.
 - ❖ This affects the credibility of Thai products and the exports of Thai businesses. The goal is to set new guidelines for issuing Certificates of Origin and to monitor the mislabeling of 65 products, mostly industrial goods, as Thai. In the long term, she called on all agencies to speed up legal reforms to impose stricter penalties on companies that mislabel products as Thai.



- The US Commerce Department plans to impose tariffs of up to 3,521% on solar panels imported from Thailand, Cambodia, Malaysia, and Vietnam. The proposed tariffs vary: Trina Solar, a China-based company, faces a 375% tariff on products made in Thailand, while some Cambodian exporters could face the full 3,521% for not cooperating with the investigation. Malaysian-made products from Jinko Solar face a lower duty of about 41%.
 - ❖ According to US Census Bureau data, the US imported nearly \$12 billion in solar equipment from these four Southeast Asian nations. These tariffs respond to allegations of Chinese subsidies and the dumping of low-priced products in the US market. Many Chinese companies have moved operations to Southeast Asia to avoid tariffs imposed since President Trump's first term.

- Sittawatchra Cheewaratnaporn, Chairman of the Thai Travel Agents Association (ATTA), stated that Thailand is facing a crisis in the Chinese tourist market. On April 16, the number of Chinese tourists continued to decline, reaching a record low of 5,833 per day, compared to the previous average of 15,000-20,000 per day.
 - ❖ This is the most severe decline since the major downturn in 2018, when the Phuket boat tragedy occurred. Several negative factors are at play, including the impact of U.S. tariffs and China's domestic tourism promotion policies.
 - ❖ While Thailand has managed to bring back at least 10,000-15,000 Chinese tourists per day, the overall number of tourists has only reached 4.2-5.5 million, falling short of the target of 7 million and also below last year's 6.7 million.
 - ❖ The Ministry of Tourism and Sports reported that from January 1 to April 20, 2025, the total number of foreign tourists was 11,272,379, generating revenue of 540,688 million baht. The top five tourist markets were China (1,524,697), Malaysia (1,401,169), Russia (835,385), India (677,793), and South Korea (549,982).
 - ❖ However, during the week of April 14-20, 2025, both short-haul and long-haul tourists slowed down after the Songkran festival, resulting in a 19.85% decrease compared to the previous week.



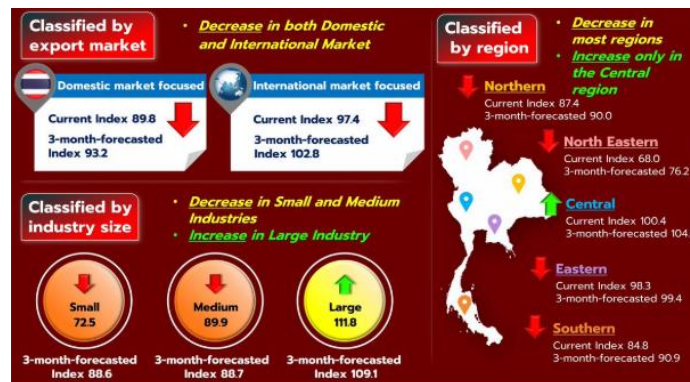
- Julapun Amornvivat, the Deputy Finance Minister, confirmed that the 10,000 baht digital wallet program for people aged 16-20 will continue as planned. Payments are expected to be made within the second quarter.
 - ❖ Currently, the program is awaiting feedback, and it is anticipated that a final proposal will be submitted for Cabinet consideration within the next 1-2 weeks.
- The Cabinet has approved the appointment of Somchai Satjapong, a former permanent finance secretary, as the new chairperson of the Bank of Thailand's board of directors.
 - ❖ Somchai was nominated by the Ministry of Finance and selected over the Bank of Thailand's nominee, Thammasat University professor Suraphol Nitikraipot. He will replace Poramettee Vimolsiri, whose term is ending. The appointment will take effect once it is announced in the Royal Gazette.



- The Federation of Thai Industries (FTI) reported that the Industrial Sentiment Index fell to 91.8 in March 2025, down from 93.4 in February, as the March 28 earthquake and subsequent aftershocks dampened tourism and slowed domestic economic activity.
 - ❖ U.S. tariffs of 25% on imported steel and aluminum, effective March 12, also weighed on sentiment. These products accounted for 18.16% and 13.29%, respectively, of Thai exports to the U.S. in 2024. Tourism experienced sharp declines, with arrivals from China and Malaysia down 44.92% and 16.57% year-on-year in February, due to safety concerns and the fasting season. Automotive exports dropped 8.34% amid delayed orders, with ripple effects on parts suppliers.

Weak agricultural prices—particularly for rice, sugarcane, and cassava—further eroded rural purchasing power.

- ❖ The three-month forward Industrial Sentiment Index also declined, falling to 95.7 from 97.6, reflecting concerns over the U.S. 25% tariff on automobiles effective April 2, along with anticipated reciprocal tariffs that could further impact Thai exports.



- The tripartite wage committee has postponed a decision to raise the daily minimum wage to 400 baht nationwide, citing economic uncertainties linked to tariffs imposed under former U.S. President Donald Trump. The previous increase, effective January 1, applied only to four provinces—Phuket, Chachoengsao, Chonburi, and Rayong—and Samui District in Surat Thani.
 - ❖ Boonsong Tabchaiyuth, Permanent Secretary for Labour and chair of the committee, said employers and workers remained divided after more than three hours of discussions. The committee tasked the secretariat with gathering additional data for further review. A follow-up meeting is expected in May.
 - ❖ The review will continue to use the existing wage calculation formula and focus on business sectors not currently under economic pressure. Employers have opposed a wage hike, citing the impact of U.S. trade measures. While sectors like services and tourism remain resilient, manufacturing—especially the automotive industry—has been more directly affected.



- Kerati Kijmanawat, President of Airports of Thailand (AOT), has submitted his resignation, which will take effect on April 24, Suriya Jungrungreangkit Transport Minister said. He had received the news from Department of Highways director-general Apirat Chaiwongnoi, who also serves as chairman of the AOT board of directors. Kerati cited the reason as needing to care for his elderly and unwell parents.
 - ❖ Regarding speculation that political pressure may have played a role in his resignation, Suriya urged people to consider whether Kerati would have remained in the position for two years if that were truly the case.
 - ❖ Suriya stated that the AOT board intends to appoint Paweena Jariyathitipong, senior executive vice president of engineering and construction, as acting President of AOT on Wednesday (April 23). The board will begin the process of selecting a new president immediately, with the expectation that it will be completed within the next three months.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,144.05 points yesterday, up 9.34 points (+0.82%) with a trading value of 35.686 billion baht. In the morning, the index dropped into negative territory before rebounding into the positive zone in the afternoon, supported by buying interest in large-cap stocks—especially CPALL and GULF, which rose significantly.
 - ❖ This movement was partly a technical rebound after the SET did not fall below the support level at 1,125 points. Also, selling pressure on banking stocks began to ease. However, there are still no new factors to push the index much higher due to ongoing uncertainty from the U.S. trade war.
 - ❖ Today, the market is expected to move sideways with a slight upward bias, but within a limited range. Investors are watching for earnings reports from real sector companies following the banking group, as well as updates from the U.S. regarding the trade conflict. Resistance is expected at 1,150 points, and support is at 1,125 points.

- This week, Jasmine International Plc is set to team up with AIS to announce a main sponsor for the live broadcast of the Premier League and the FA Cup for a total of six seasons, starting from the 2025 to 2026 season.
 - ❖ It is expected that the monthly subscription fee for all live matches will be reduced from 429 baht to 329 baht. The goal is to increase the target number of subscribers in the first year from 1-1.5 million to 2-2.5 million.

Political News

- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra said there will be no cabinet reshuffle at this time. Her remarks followed speculation about a reshuffle ahead of the first reading of the 2026 budget, amid reports of tension between Pheu Thai and coalition partner Bhumjaithai.
 - ❖ Paetongtarn said there are no such plans and rejected talk that Palang Pracharath will replace Bhumjaithai in the coalition. She said things will stay the same for now.
 - ❖ At one point after the meeting to speed up the use of the 2025 national budget, which was chaired by Paetongtarn, Phumtham Wechayachai, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defence, was seen walking arm-in-arm with Anutin, smiling and in a good mood as they came down from the Thai Khu Fah building. Phumtham said they would "join hands forever."



- Meanwhile PPRP leader Gen Prawit Wongsuwan dismissed talk that his party would rejoin Pheu Thai if Bhumjaithai is dropped from the coalition. He shook his head when asked and gave no comment.
 - ❖ On April 27, General Prawit Wongsuwan, leader of the Palang Pracharath Party (PPRP), will hold the party's annual general meeting for 2025 at the party's office, Ratchdawan Building, in Bangkok. The meeting will be held in accordance with the political party law to review and amend the party's regulations and appoint additional members to the party's executive committee.



- Yesterday, the Cabinet meeting acknowledged a proposed anti-corruption measure regarding the rehiring of individuals who were previously dismissed from government service for disciplinary offenses related to corruption. The proposal, suggested by the NACC, tasks the Office of the Civil Service Commission (OCSC) with reviewing and summarizing the issue, then submitting the results to the Cabinet Secretariat within 30 days for further consideration by the Cabinet.
- Defense Minister Phumtham Wechayachai has canceled his trip to the southern border provinces and called an urgent meeting with security agencies following the fatal shooting of a 16-year-old novice monk in Songkhla's Saba Yoi District.
 - ❖ The attack occurred around 6:30 a.m. on Suan On Road, about 500 meters from Wat Kura, when gunmen opened fire on a pickup truck belonging to Pol Lt Wathana Chumapan of Saba Yoi Police Station. He was transporting six monks and novices to collect alms. Wathana returned fire and drove the injured to Saba Yoi Hospital. His son, novice Pongkorn Chumapan, 16, was pronounced dead on arrival. Another novice, Pokanit Morasin, 12, sustained minor injuries.
 - ❖ Phumtham noted the attack comes amid the school break, when many boys join summer ordinations. He said there have been multiple recent incidents targeting Buddhist communities and called the situation urgent.
- Kit Chambers, the brother of Paul Chambers, an American academic charged with royal defamation by Thailand's 3rd Army Region, called on the U.S. government to address the unjust treatment of his brother.
 - ❖ In an article for The Oklahoman, Kit Chambers stated that his brother was falsely charged with lèse-majesté. In October 2024, Paul was listed as a speaker at a conference hosted by Singapore's Institute of Southeast Asian Studies. Kit explained that someone in the Thai military had misinterpreted a description of Paul's topic, leading to criminal charges in April 2025.

- ❖ Paul was temporarily detained but is now out on bail with conditions, including wearing an ankle monitor and being prohibited from leaving the country while his visa has been revoked.
- ❖ Kit Chambers asserted that all his brother seeks is to return to Oklahoma. He pointed out that while U.S. and Thai officials are in tariff negotiations, an American citizen faces false charges and potential imprisonment.



Earthquake Tragedy

- Justice Minister Tawe Sodsong affirmed on Tuesday that the Chinese government would not be permitted to interfere in ongoing legal proceedings involving China Railway No.10 (CREC) (Thailand) Co Ltd, a subsidiary of China's state-owned China Railway Group.
 - ❖ The declaration following reports that Chuanling Zhang, director of CREC Thailand, had informed investigators from the Department of Special Investigation (DSI) that he was an official appointed by the Chinese state firm to oversee its Thai operations. Zhang also stated that the parent company had authorised a budget of 120 million baht to compensate victims affected by a building collapse involving the ITD-CREC joint venture.
 - ❖ However, Tawe clarified that despite CREC being a Chinese state enterprise, the Chinese government could not intervene in the Thai judicial process. He further emphasised that Zhang's statement would have no bearing on the investigation or its outcome.



- China Railway No. 10 (Thailand), the contractor of the collapsed State Audit Office (SAO) building, will set aside 120 million baht to compensate victims of the tragedy. Currently, 51 people have been confirmed dead, with nine injured and 43 still missing.

General News

- Former deputy attorney-general Nate Naksuk was sentenced to three years in prison for malfeasance in connection with the Red Bull heir hit-and-run case. Meanwhile Former national police chief Pol Gen Somyot Poompanmoung was acquitted.
 - ❖ The case involved eight defendants accused of misconduct, including altering the recorded speed of Vorayuth "Boss" Yoovidhya's Ferrari in the 2012 crash that killed Pol Sen Sgt-Major Wichian Klanprasert, and dropping a reckless driving charge against him.
 - ❖ The Central Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct Cases also sentenced former senior prosecutor Chainarong Saengthong-aram to two years for interfering with the investigation. They were granted bail with a surety of 200,000 baht.



- ❖ The court found Nate had unlawfully used his discretion to protect Vorayuth, with no factual basis, damaging the integrity of the justice system. Other defendants were acquitted, but the court ordered warrants for their detention.



- At around 2:00 a.m. on April 23 in Chiang Mai province, a fire broke out inside the Dhara Dhevi Hotel. Authorities were able to bring the fire under control. So far, there have been no reports of injuries or deaths.
- ❖ The Dhara Dhevi Hotel Chiang Mai was established in 2002. It is a 5-star hotel known for its traditional Lanna-style architecture. The hotel is located in Tha Sala Subdistrict, Mueang district, Chiang Mai, and covers an area of 150 rai.

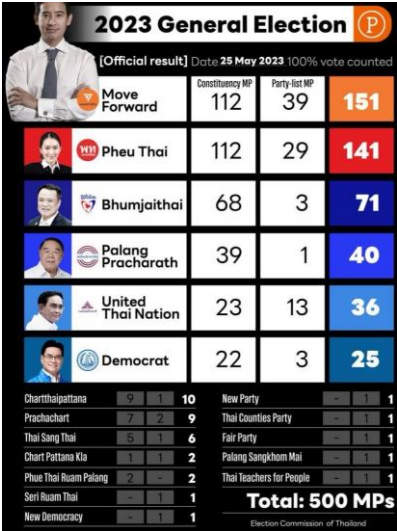
