## **Thai Enquirer News Summary**

### **Economic News**

- A source from the Ministry of Finance revealed that Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Phichai Chunhawachira is planning to meet again soon with Sethaput Suthiwartnarueput, Governor of the Bank of Thailand, to discuss a new low-interest loan (soft loan) program.
  - ❖ The aim is to help exporters and related supply chain businesses affected by the tariff policies of U.S. President Donald Trump. The discussion will include easing the loan application criteria to allow banks to lend more easily to affected businesses. The total budget for the soft loan program will be considered after the results of the ongoing Thailand-U.S. trade talks are known.

- ❖ Other topics to be discussed include monetary policy, Thailand's holdings of U.S. bonds, and the capital market.

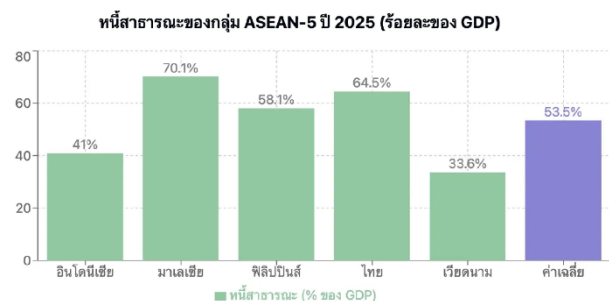


- The Ministry of Finance plans a 500 billion baht stimulus to mitigate the effects of Trump's tariff policy, with a decision expected by May, according to Minister Pichai Chunhavajira. He noted that extra borrowing for the stimulus could increase public debt by 3%, but that would still be below the current 70% ceiling.
  - ❖ His comments came after the IMF revised its forecast for Thailand's GDP growth in 2025, from 2.9% to 1.8%, and for 2026, from 2.6% to 1.6%. Pichai called it a preliminary estimate, unlikely to drop that much due to ongoing uncertainties. While acknowledging potential impacts, he reassured that the government is prepared with measures to support growth.
  - ❖ Pichai stressed that the stimulus must be substantial, suggesting at least 500 billion baht, with a focus on domestic consumption, investment, and soft loans. Talks with relevant agencies, including the National Economic and Social Development Council and the Bank of Thailand, are ongoing to finalize funding sources.



- On the morning of April 23, in Washington D.C., USA (or early evening Thailand time), the IMF revealed its outlook on global public debt at the IMF-World Bank Spring Meeting. It stated that global public debt is on the rise and expressed concern that Thailand's public debt is higher than the ASEAN average.

- ❖ Era Dabla-Norris, Deputy Director of the IMF's Fiscal Affairs Department, discussed the public debt situation in ASEAN and Thailand. She noted that the fiscal positions of ASEAN countries vary greatly.
- ❖ Overall, the debt-to-GDP ratio in ASEAN is lower than in other emerging markets and developing countries. However, Thailand's debt is slightly higher than other ASEAN nations, exceeding 60% of GDP. As a result, the IMF recommends that the Thai government adopt cautious fiscal policies.



- Today at 10:00 AM, Pichai Nariphaphan, Minister of Commerce, will announce Thailand's export figures for March and the first quarter of 2025. The announcement will be broadcast live on Facebook at <https://www.facebook.com/TPSO.MOC>.



- ❖ Previously, the Ministry of Commerce reported that Thailand's exports in February 2025 were valued at \$26.71 billion, an increase of 14%. This marked the eighth straight month of growth and the second consecutive month of double-digit growth, following January's 13.6% rise. Imports in February were valued at \$24.72 billion, up 4%, resulting in a trade surplus of \$1.99 billion for the month.
- ❖ The Ministry expects exports in March to continue growing, driven by increased investment.

- foodpanda Thailand has announced that it will discontinue the foodpanda application, with the service officially ending on May 23, 2025. foodpanda has operated in Thailand since 2012. It started with food orders via website and hotline, later growing into a full delivery platform. Services now include pick-up, dine-in, and delivery of groceries and household items.
- ❖ Founded in Singapore, foodpanda is now owned by Berlin-based Delivery Hero. In Thailand, it is run by Delivery Hero (Thailand), registered on March 2, 2012, originally as Foodpanda (Thailand), and renamed in July 2019. The company has

registered capital of 204 million baht. Delivery Hero said it will shift focus to other Asia-Pacific markets with stronger returns.

- The Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,153.77 points yesterday, up 9.72 points (+0.85%), with a trading value of 38.22 billion baht. The market rose in line with regional stock markets and the Dow Jones Futures, which gained due to easing tensions in the trade war.

- ❖ This came after signals from the U.S. Treasury Secretary and President Donald Trump that tariffs on Chinese goods may be reduced in the future, though not entirely removed, suggesting negotiations may resume.
- ❖ Thai stocks also gained support from electronics shares such as DELTA and CCET. DELTA recorded the highest trading value of the day at 4.16 billion baht, closing at 76.50 baht, up 7.25 baht.
- ❖ Today, the index may face some short-term pullbacks. Investors should watch for updates from the Dow Jones, Thailand's export figures from the Commerce Ministry, and the revised 2025 GDP forecast following the IMF's downgrade. Also in focus are the Q1 2025 earnings reports from listed companies. Support is expected at 1,140–1,146 points, with resistance at 1,156–1,160 points.



- The Stock Exchange of Thailand announced that starting from May 6, 2025, it will implement the Auto Pause measure for individual stocks. This is to give brokerage firms and investors time to review and manage unusually large buy or sell orders.
- ❖ A "Pause (P)" sign will appear on stocks with unusually high trading activity, and trading will automatically stop for 60 minutes—40 minutes for the pause and 20 minutes for the pre-open session—before resuming normal trading. The Auto Pause can be applied no more than once per day per stock.

- Yesterday, gold prices were highly volatile, changing 37 times throughout the day. By the end of trading, prices had dropped by 1,750 baht compared to the previous day, due to selling pressure after tensions in the U.S.-China trade war eased.
- ❖ The closing price for gold bars was 52,700 baht for selling and 52,600 baht for buying. For gold jewelry, the selling price was 53,500 baht and the buying price was 51,650.12 baht.

## **Political News**

- A government source commented on the rumors of a Cabinet reshuffle, saying that although Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra has stated there are no plans for changes, the situation remains calm for now.



- ❖ Current ministers reportedly prefer to keep their positions so they can continue working on solving problems. However, it is believed the Prime Minister is carefully considering the timing and suitability of any reshuffle to avoid internal conflicts within the government and the Pheu Thai Party.
  - ❖ The source added that the reshuffle rumors mainly come from some members within the Pheu Thai Party who are hoping to secure Cabinet positions now that six months have passed. Some key figures from coalition parties also see this as a chance to get the ministerial roles.
- However, reports suggest that a Cabinet reshuffle could happen as early as the beginning of May. The reshuffle would mainly involve members of the Pheu Thai Party, while other coalition parties may submit their preferred candidates.
- ❖ The Ruam Thai Sang Chart Party may promote Suchart Chomklin to Deputy Minister of Commerce, while Bhumjaithai Party has confirmed that it will not make any changes.



- ❖ The reason for moving up the reshuffle before the budget bill review is due to pressure from recent poll results and former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, who reportedly wants to see changes. However, Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra is still hesitant. As a compromise, Thaksin has requested that adjustments be made in areas where they are possible for now.



- The names of former Culture Minister Sermsak Pongpanit and former Defense Minister Sutin Klungsang are being considered for reappointment, along with a possible reshuffle for Deputy Prime Minister and Defense Minister Phumtham Wechayachai, who could be moved back to Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Commerce.
  - ❖ Meanwhile, Commerce Minister Pichai Nariphaphan, Tourism and Sports Minister Sorawong Thianthong, and Deputy Interior Minister Thirat Rattanawanich may lose their positions. Prime Minister Paetongtarn is reportedly hesitant to make changes, while former Prime Minister Thaksin wants to reshuffle. As a compromise, he has suggested moving Jiraporn Sindhuprai, the Minister to the Prime Minister's Office, to become Deputy Finance Minister in place of Paopoom Rojanasakul.
  - ❖ Additionally, reports suggest that Wisut Chainarun, a list MP and the Government Whip, may be appointed as the new Deputy Interior Minister.



- Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra met with Cambodian Senate President Samdech Techo Hun Sen on Wednesday, as the two nations commemorate the 75th anniversary of their diplomatic relations.



- ❖ Paetongtarn arrived in Cambodia on Wednesday morning and held talks with several high-ranking Cambodian officials, including Prime Minister Hun Manet, before meeting with Hun Sen, who is known to be a close ally of her father, former Thai PM Thaksin Shinawatra. This marks Paetongtarn’s second visit to Cambodia since Hun Manet assumed office in August 2023.
- ❖ Hun Sen is “determined” to strengthen bilateral ties to foster peace and prosperity through economic and trade cooperation, especially in response to ongoing global economic uncertainties. The former Cambodian prime minister also conveyed his willingness to support Thailand in enhancing regional collaboration, he said.
- ❖ During the visit, Thailand and Cambodia signed seven Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs). These covered cooperation on the Cambodia Friendship Bridge (Ban Nong Ian – Stung Bot), environmental initiatives, labour skill development, labour employment, infrastructure development, the construction of a new border bridge at Ban Pak Kard, and the launch of the official logo marking the 75th anniversary of diplomatic relations.



- The bill to legalise casinos within entertainment complexes is scheduled to be considered after the fiscal 2026 budget bill and two decrees on digital assets and cybercrime prevention. The budget bill is expected to be debated between May 28 and 30.
  - ❖ House Speaker Wan Muhamad Noor Matha said it is up to the government to decide when the bill will be brought forward, but for now, it is in the queue after the budget and the decrees. He declined to comment on opposition from some Prachachat MPs, noting he is now House Speaker, not party leader. Personally, he said, as a Muslim, he cannot support the bill.
  - ❖ On whether the bill could trigger a House dissolution, Wan Noor said that decision rests with the Prime Minister. If a government bill fails, the options are resignation or dissolution, but this has not yet become an issue.
- Payu Nerngchamng, Deputy Spokesperson of the ruling Pheu Thai Party, has filed a defamation lawsuit against opposition MP Rukchanok Srinork of the People's Party.
  - ❖ Payu accused Rukchanok of falsely claiming he insulted the grassroots population. He said she also used the phrase "licking the boss's shoes" to attack him. He stated that this is not the first instance of such behavior and that he will not tolerate it further.

## **Earthquake Tragedy**

- Samples of 20mm rebar, manufactured by the Xin Ke Yuan steel company, have failed the “mass value per meter” tests for the second time, Industry Ministry Spokesman Pongpol Yodmuangcharoen said.
  - ❖ The results of the second set of tests, conducted by the Iron and Steel Institute of Thailand, in accordance with the standard set by the Thailand Industrial Standard Institute (TISI), are similar to the initial tests earlier this month.
  - ❖ Pongpol noted, however, that samples of 32mm rebar, from the same Chinese-owned manufacturer, which failed the previous “yield value per meter” tests, have passed the second set of testing, adding that the latest set of results will be sent to the Department of Special Investigation, as part of the evidence in the ongoing probe to determine the exact cause of the collapse of the SAO building on March 28<sup>th</sup>.
  - ❖ The Ministry of Industry is considering revoking the operating license of the Xin Ke Yuan company, if it is proven that its rebar used in the construction of the SAO building was not up to the standards set by the TISI.

## **General News**

- The Faculty of Law at Chulalongkorn University has released a statement regarding the arrest made by the Cyber Crime Investigation Bureau (CCIB). The case involves a suspect accused of copying entrance exam questions from the faculty and giving them to a former high-ranking police officer in 2023.
  - ❖ The part-time bachelor's degree program (evening class) was first contacted by the CCIB on April 6, 2025, and has since fully cooperated with the investigation. The university has also formed a fact-finding committee to look into the matter.
  - ❖ The suspect, identified as Khanittha, is a 53-year-old independent academic with a doctoral degree. She is not an alumna or staff member of the university.
  - ❖ Reports say investigators found evidence of five money transfers, totaling 300,000–400,000 baht, from mule accounts linked to an illegal gambling website to Khanittha. The case is also connected to the well-known former police officer.



- The Ministry of Education is lifting the requirement for scout uniforms, allowing schools to decide for themselves what students should wear during activities, said Deputy Education Minister Surasak Phanchaoenworakul.
  - ❖ He said the National Scout Organization will issue an official announcement by the end of April, exempting schools under the ministry from the mandatory scout uniform rule. The decision takes into account local economic conditions and climate. Three types of scout uniforms will be recognized: ceremonial, training, and casual, with schools free to choose what's appropriate.
  - ❖ For example, students may wear their PE or regular uniforms with a scout neckerchief during scout classes. The move is aimed at easing the financial burden on parents, who will no longer need to buy new scout uniforms.



- At 2:00 AM on April 23, a crash involving a Ferrari, a Mercedes-Benz, and a pickup truck occurred. The Ferrari and the Mercedes-Benz were completely destroyed by fire. There were no injuries or deaths.
  - ❖ Later, Kamol brought his 22-year-old son “Fias,” the Ferrari driver, to give a statement. He claimed the pickup truck had cut in front of him, leading to the crash. Police are still questioning everyone involved to find out exactly what caused the accident.
