## Thai Enquirer News Summary

### **Economic News**

- Deputy Prime Minister and Finance Minister Pichai Chunhavajira expects Thailand's GDP in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of this year to exceed 2.5%, possibly reaching around 3%. However, he noted that global economic conditions must be closely monitored, as they could affect exports. If the situation worsens, the government is ready to introduce support measures, with a focus on reviewing the budget and avoiding unnecessary new debt.
  - ❖ The 2026 budget is currently under parliamentary review. The government plans to work with parliament to allocate funds for urgent needs and may require a large amount of money to boost the economy, including the possible revision of the digital wallet scheme.

- ❖ Meanwhile, investment promotion applications in the first 3 months of 2025 totaled over 400 billion Baht, or about 40–50% of GDP. This shows that Thailand remains attractive for investment.
- ❖ At the same time, the Finance Ministry plans to propose changes to the “Khun Soo Rao Chuay” debt relief program. The debt limit for those eligible will be raised from 5,000 Baht to 10,000 Baht, and then possibly expanded to 30,000 Baht. The proposal is expected to be submitted to the Cabinet between June and July.



- Pornchai Thiraveja, director-general of the Fiscal Policy Office stated that The Ministry of Finance has cut its forecast for Thailand's economic growth this year to 2.1% from 3%, saying that the impact of US tariffs and a global slowdown would weigh on Southeast Asia's 2<sup>nd</sup> largest economy.
  - ❖ However, if the US eventually chooses to impose only a 10% tariff on Thai imports rather than the announced 36%, gross domestic product (GDP) growth could reach 2.5%.



- ❖ Exports, a key driver of Thai growth, are seen as rising 2.3% this year, down from an earlier forecast of 4.4%.
- ❖ The forecasts came a day after the Bank of Thailand cut interest rates at a 2<sup>nd</sup> consecutive meeting and lowered its own forecasts for the economy this year.



- The Criminal Court for Corruption and Misconduct Cases has sentenced Thai multi-billionaire Prayudh Mahagitsiri to 24 years in prison, for his involvement in malfeasance related to the issuance of land title deeds in the Sikhio district of Nakhon Ratchasima. His daughter, Usana, was sentenced to 12 years, after being found guilty on the same charges.

- ❖ The Court stated that Prayudh, 79, president of Thainox Stainless Co., Ltd., which operates a golf resort business in the district, colluded with Land Department officials to acquire land in reserved forest areas on illegally issued title deeds.

The defendants also purchased land with legitimate deeds and connected it to Prayudh's Mountain Creek golf course, adding over 30 hectares to the existing 369 hectares of the course.

- ❖ Prayudh is known as a Thai coffee king and, as of 2025, his net worth is estimated at US\$2.6 billion, ranking him at 1,462 on Forbes' list of global billionaires and the 10<sup>th</sup> richest Thai national.



- Today marks the launch of the special Thai ESGX mutual funds, which are now open for subscription to accommodate investors switching from long-term equity funds (LTFs). The offering period will run for two months, from May 2 to June 30, 2025.
- ❖ Currently, there are 37 Thai ESGX funds managed by 19 asset management companies and are ready to receive new investments and transfers from 80 LTFs offered by approximately 20 companies. The transition is expected to involve between 400,000 to 500,000 investors.

- ❖ Chavinda Hanratanakool, Managing Director of Krung Thai Asset Management (KTAM) and Chair of the Association of Investment Management Companies (AIMC), stated that the launch of the 37 ESGX funds will help stimulate the Thai stock market.
- ❖ She expressed confidence that more than 50% of LTF assets—equivalent to over 80 billion Baht—will be transferred into these new funds, alongside an estimated 20 billion Baht in new investments, totaling over 100 billion Baht.
- On April 30, the Stock Exchange of Thailand (SET) index closed at 1,197.26 points, gaining 26.14 points (+2.23%) with a trading value of 54.37 billion Baht.
  - ❖ The index jumped sharply after the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) decided to cut the policy rate by 0.25%, bringing it down to 1.75%, in line with market expectations. The rally was driven by strong buying interest in large-cap stocks.



- ❖ The top 5 most actively traded stocks were led by DELTA, which saw a trading value of 6.41 billion Baht and closed at 98.00 Baht, rising by 10.00 Baht.
  - KBANK followed with 3.97 billion Baht in turnover, closing at 159.50 Baht, up 5.00 Baht.
  - ADVANC recorded a trading value of 3.41 billion Baht, ending the day at 295.00 Baht, gaining 11.00 Baht.
  - KTB posted 2.60 billion Baht in trading value and closed at 21.80 Baht, an increase of 0.80 Baht.

- Lastly, CPALL saw 2.38 billion Baht in turnover, finishing at 51.50 Baht, up 1.25 Baht.

- ❖ The market is expected to move sideways today while waiting for new catalysts. Resistance is seen at 1,200–1,210 points, with support at 1,170–1,180 points.



- On April 30, there were two big lot transactions of Kasikornbank (KBANK) shares, totaling 3 million shares with a combined value of 467.25 million Baht. The average price was 155.75 Baht per share, which was below the market price.

- ❖ KBANK shares closed at 159.50 Baht, up 5.00 Baht or 3.24%, with the day's high at 160.00 Baht and the low at 153.50 Baht. Total trading value was 4.44 billion Baht.
- ❖ Meanwhile, the Stock Exchange of Thailand released updated information on KBANK's shareholders following the latest book closing. It showed that Gulf Energy Development Plc (GULF) increased its holdings in KBANK to 82 million shares, representing a 3.49% stake, making GULF the 4<sup>th</sup> largest shareholder.

- Siam Cement Plc (SCC) reported a net profit of 1.099 billion Baht for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2025, down 55% year-on-year. However, the result significantly exceeded the analysts' consensus estimate of 517 million Baht by 113%.
  - ❖ Excluding the performance of Long Son Petrochemicals (LSP) in Vietnam, SCC's core business generated a profit of 4.019 billion Baht.
  - ❖ Looking ahead, SCC expects stronger performance in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter of 2025 and maintains its full-year sales growth target of 3–5%. However, the company is closely monitoring the trade war situation, with clearer impacts anticipated in the third and fourth quarters.
  - ❖ Despite the sharp year-on-year drop in net profit, brokers noted that the figure beat most analysts' forecasts, which could provide a short-term positive signal for SCC shares.
- Labour groups, including the Thai Labour Solidarity Committee and the State Enterprises Workers' Relations Confederation, held a workers' march for “May Day 2025 – International Workers’ Day” at the Democracy Monument.
  - ❖ The march moved to Government House to submit demands for the protection of labor rights, such as 180 days of maternity leave, fair wages in response to rising inflation, and opposition to the plan to legalise casinos inside entertainment complexes and online gambling.
  - ❖ They also commemorated workers who died in the collapse of the State Audit Office building.



- On Wednesday the Bank of Thailand's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) voted 5 to 2 to cut the policy interest rate by 0.25 percentage points, from 2.00% to 1.75% per year, with immediate effect. The MPC said global trade tensions, driven by U.S. policy shifts and reactions from major economies, are expected to reshape global economic, financial, and trade dynamics.

- ❖ Although the impact is still in early stages, uncertainty is high, and global growth is slowing. Thailand's economy is showing signs of slower growth, with rising downside risks from weaker global trade and a decline in foreign tourists. Headline inflation is expected to fall below the target range due to lower oil prices and government measures. Financial conditions remain tight, with a slight contraction in overall credit and weaker loan quality, especially in housing and businesses facing structural issues.
- ❖ Looking ahead, global trade policy is expected to weigh more heavily on the economy starting mid-2025. Under a baseline scenario with continued trade tensions and steady U.S. tariffs, Thai GDP in 2025 may grow around 2.0%. In a more severe trade conflict, growth could fall to 1.3%. The actual impact will depend on global policy responses, requiring close monitoring of trade developments.



คณะกรรมการฯ มีมติ 5 ต่อ 2 ให้ลดอัตราดอกเบี้ยนโยบายร้อยละ 0.25 เป็นร้อยละ 1.75 ต่อปี โดย 2 เสียง เห็นควรให้คงอัตราดอกเบี้ยนโยบาย

- เศรษฐกิจมีแนวโน้มขยายตัวลดลงและมีความเสี่ยงด้านต่ำเพิ่มขึ้น โดยนโยบายการคลังของประเทศเศรษฐกิจหลักในปัจจุบันยังคงขาดดุลงบประมาณ ส่งผลต่อการประเมินผลกระทบต่อแนวโน้มเศรษฐกิจและเงินเฟ้อในระยะต่อไป
- อัตราเงินเฟ้อมีแนวโน้มลดลงต่ำกว่ากรอบเป้าหมายจากราคาส่งงานและมาตรการภาครัฐ เป็นสำคัญ
- ภาวะการเงินโดยรวมยังตึงตัว และต้องติดตามความเสี่ยง macro-financial feedback loop ที่อาจเพิ่มขึ้น

กรรมการส่วนใหญ่เห็นควรให้ลดอัตราดอกเบี้ยในครั้งนี้เพื่อให้สอดคล้องกับแนวโน้มเศรษฐกิจและรองรับความเสี่ยงด้านต่ำที่เพิ่มขึ้น รวมทั้งดูแลภาวะการเงินให้เหมาะสมกับแนวโน้มเศรษฐกิจและเงินเฟ้อที่เปลี่ยนไป ขณะที่กรรมการ 2 ท่าน เห็นควรให้คงอัตราดอกเบี้ย เพื่อใช้ในจังหวะที่เกิดประสิทธิผลสูงสุด ภายใต้ขีดความสามารถของนโยบายการเงิน (policy space) ที่มีจำกัด



**Political News**

- Winyat Chartmontree, personal lawyer of former Prime Minister Thaksin Shinawatra, commented on the Supreme Court's Criminal Division for Holders of Political Positions deciding to conduct its own inquiry into Thaksin's stay on the 14<sup>th</sup> floor of the Police General Hospital. The court is looking into whether his hospital stay complied with the prison sentence order.

- ❖ The lawyer said they will wait to receive the court's official notice and will submit an explanation within 30 days. He expressed confidence in their explanation, saying Thaksin was officially sentenced, received the prison order, and was properly transferred to prison.
- ❖ He added that Thaksin is not worried and will not appear in person on June 13, but will send a written explanation instead.



- The Regional Chief Public Prosecutor of Region 6 has decided not to indict Dr. Paul Chambers, an American academic at Naresuan University, on charges of lèse-majesté and violating the Computer Crime Act.
  - ❖ The Phitsanulok Provincial Prosecutor will request his release from the Phitsanulok Court and forward the case file and non-prosecution order to the Commissioner of Provincial Police Region 6, who may review and contest the decision.
  - ❖ The Appeals Court Region 6 has granted Dr Paul Chambers permission to remove his electronic monitoring (EM) device, the Thai Lawyers for Human Rights (TLHR) reported.



- Korkaew Pikulthong, a party-list MP from the Pheu Thai Party, posted on Facebook to thank the Region 6 Chief Prosecutor for the decision not to indict Dr. Paul. He said the decision helps reduce negative factors that the United States could have used in trade talks with Thailand, especially during a time when both countries are preparing to discuss customs tariff issues.

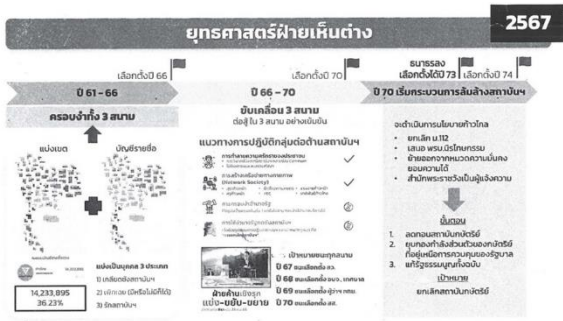

- ISOC has admitted to monitoring certain individuals and groups for national security reasons but denied running disinformation campaigns or cyberattacks. Leaked documents submitted to a House committee listed public figures like Thaksin Shinawatra, Anutin Charnvirakul, and Pita Limjaroenrat as “high-value targets,” accusing them of exploiting the monarchy or being linked to anti-monarchy movements.
  - ❖ The documents also list civil society groups, opposition parties, and pro-democracy figures such as former Move Forward Party leader Pita Limjaroenrat and Progressive Movement’s Pannika Wanich as “high-value targets” for information operations. ISOC further categorized the People's Party and pro-democracy movements as part of an anti-monarchist network.
  - ❖ ISOC confirmed the documents are real but said the classifications were based on general internet data, not political targeting.

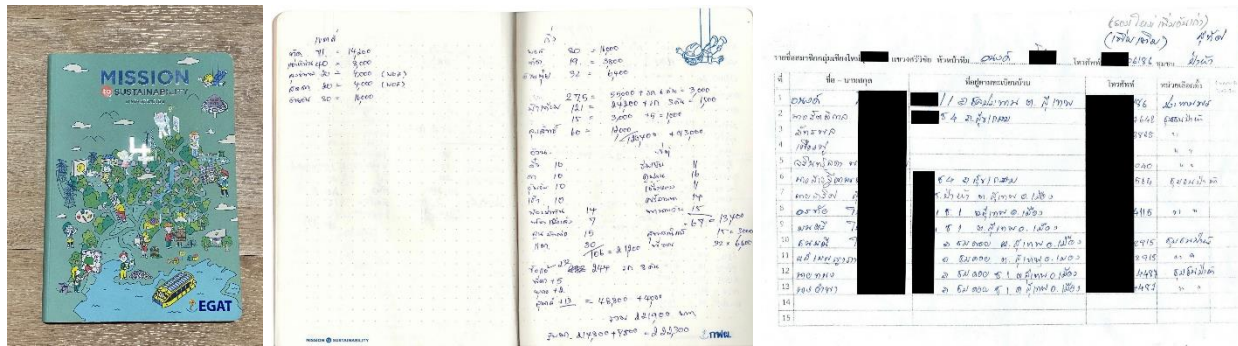

- ❖ Army spokesperson Maj Gen Winthai Suwaree said the military's role is focused on public relations, not attacking critics. He stressed that the army only aims to correct misunderstandings and provide accurate information. He also denied any ties to online accounts that target pro-democracy groups, saying the army communicates openly and legally through public channels.



- Chaithawat Tulathon, former leader of the Move Forward Party, who is also helping campaign for the People’s Party, posted a photo on X showing a notebook listing names of local canvassers for a rival party in the Chiang Mai City Municipality election.
  - ❖ The notebook was reportedly dropped and picked up by the People’s Party’s campaign team. The notebook contains details such as names of people responsible for bringing supporters to campaign rallies, with a noted cost of 200 Baht per person.
  - ❖ Today, the party’s Chiang Mai team plans to submit a letter to the Election Commission (EC) to request an investigation.



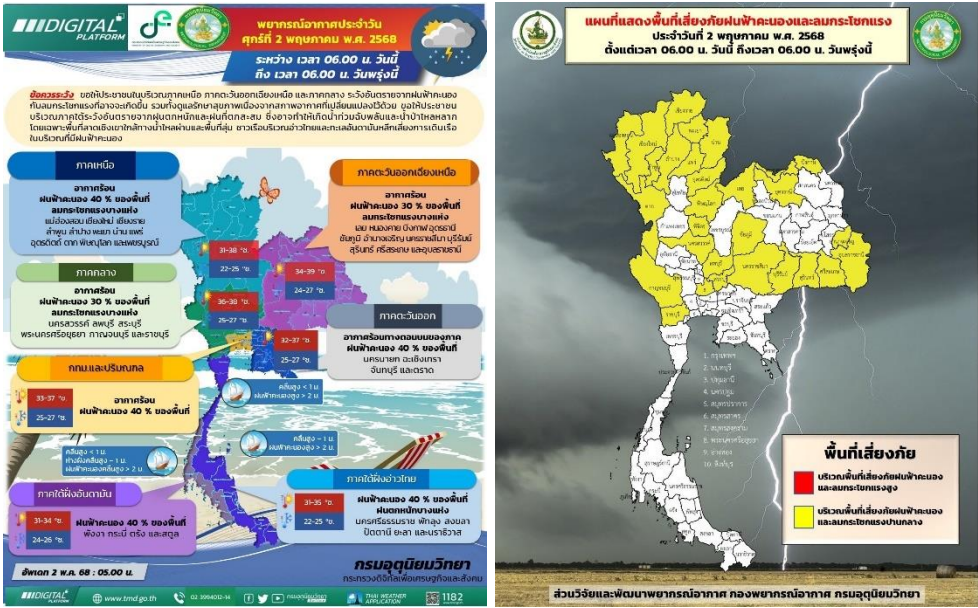
## General News

- Authorities will conduct the first test of the emergency alert system using cell broadcast technology today at 1 p.m.
  - ❖ This small-scale test will take place in five pilot areas: the provincial halls of Chiang Rai, Ubon Ratchathani, Suphan Buri, and Songkhla, as well as Buildings A and B of the Government Complex on Chaeng Watthana Road in Bangkok. Alerts will be sent directly to all mobile phones in the area, accompanied by a loud tone—

even if devices are on silent—which may cause alarm. Authorities emphasize that this is only a test.



- The Meteorological Department has warned that upper Thailand, including Bangkok, will face very hot weather today, reaching 38°C. Thunderstorms and heavy rain are expected in 40% of the area, with strong winds. People are advised to watch out for storms, flash floods, and runoff. A total of 49 provinces may be affected.



- A 53-year-old male construction worker with diabetes has died from anthrax in Mukdahan, with at least 247 people identified as potentially exposed.
  - ❖ The man developed skin lesions on his right hand on April 24 and was hospitalized on April 27 with worsening symptoms—necrotic wounds, swollen lymph nodes in the right armpit, dizziness, and seizures. He died shortly after admission.
  - ❖ Doctors suspected anthrax and confirmed the presence of *Bacillus anthracis* through lab tests by the Department of Medical Sciences and Bamrasnaradura Infectious Diseases Institute. The source is believed to be contact with infected

cattle during a merit-making event where a cow was slaughtered and the meat shared in the village.

- ❖ Health authorities have identified 247 individuals exposed: 28 involved in butchering and 219 who consumed raw beef. High-risk contacts are receiving prophylactic antibiotics, and containment measures are underway.

**Background Information**

According to the report by the Election Commission of Thailand as of May 8, 2019, the strength of each party in the Thai Parliament following the elections on March 24, 2019.
